HISTORY AND TRANSFORMATION OF INTERNATIONAL/NATIONAL RED CROSS

Purpose behind the Establishment of the Red Cross (Why should we adopt).

The Red Cross Society is a worldwide, well known, universally accepted, admired and internationally identified humanitarian service organization. It is the biggest, independent non-religious, non-political, non-sectarian and voluntary relief organization treating people equally all over the world without any discrimination as to their nationality race and religion beliefs. It was established in 1863 in Geneva, Switzerland. The Father of Red Cross movement and recipient of noble award for peace in 1901 was "Jean Henry Dunant", who was a successful businessman. While going on a business mission, Dunant came on 24th June 1859 to Castiglione. It was on the same day, the battle of Solferino was fought nearby between French and Austrian armies. Dunant was horrified and moved by the sight and plight of the wounded soldiers. On witnessing the pathetic scene he forgot his business and started relief operations to all the wounded soldiers without any discrimination taking the help from people in villages nearby. In 1862 Dunant wrote a book "A memory of Solferino" which paved the way for the first Geneva Conference in 26th October 1863. The Geneva Society for Public Welfare, consider the Dunant's proposals which was mentioned in the book and convene a multinational conference for implementing them

The two proposals are:

- Formation of trained medical relief team in every country in peace time to be employed in the relief work for wounded soldiers in the battle field.
- Framing of rules to alleviate the suffering of war victims and to have international treaty among the nations once agreed upon and satisfied might assure humane care for wounded.

Based on the proposals a resolution for the formation of medical relief societies "Society for the relief of wounded combatants" was passed and the Red Cross Emblem to protect the members of Relief team was adopted. The name was changed subsequently in the year 1867 as "Red Cross Society" by Netherland. In 1875 the five member commission of the Geneva Society for Public Welfare began to call itself the International Committee of Red Cross (ICRC). In 1876 Muslim countries adopted Red Cross emblem on white background instead

of Red Cross. The Red Cross Societies in times of peace pursue a variety of activities devoted to the health, safety and well-being of the people, with the best relationship, understanding and cooperation between many governments and their national societies.




The involvement and contribution of young people to the work of the Red Cross has an interesting history. This genesis of their engagement originated in the province of Québec, Canada in 1914, when school children first participated in the humanitarian work of the Red Cross work by making bandages, dressings and other comforts for soldiers. The idea soon spread to Europe, United States Australia, Italy, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, New Zealand, Poland, Switzerland, United Kingdom and Yugoslavia France, Japan, Romania and Sweden in short duration.

In 1922, the youth programme of the Red Cross was officially recognized and supported by Resolution No. XVIII adopted by the General Council of League of Red Cross Societies and the expansion of Red Cross youth programme to young people outside the schools or other than those attending educational institution were embodied in one of the General Councils resolutions XIX.

The Red Cross, through its junior and youth programme, plays an important role in channelling and guiding this young energy in the cause of humanitarian action. The following lines throw the glimpse of youth red cross.

The main purpose of organizing the Youth Red Cross is:

- ❖ Informing youth members and others the role and the responsibilities of the Red Cross and encourage them to contribute.
- ❖ An awareness on the care of their own health and that of others
- ❖ To understand and acceptance of civic responsibilities and acting accordingly with humanitarian concern, to fulfil the same.
- ❖ To enable the growth and development of a spirit of service and sense of duty with dedication and devotion in the minds of youth.
- ❖ To foster better friendly relationship with all without any discrimination.

Students in colleges and those aged 18 to 30 years of age may join the Youth Red Cross as volunteers.

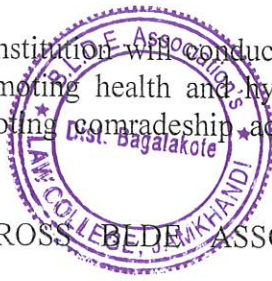

YOUTH RED CROSS POLICY,

ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTIVES & PROGRAM GUIDELINES

POLICY:

The Youth Red Cross is a most important constituent of its mother organization Indian Red Cross Society. YRC aims at inculcating the 7 fundamental principles of the Red Cross movement viz., Humanity, Impartiality, Neutrality, Independence, Voluntary Service, Unity and Universality. The Youth Red Cross is organized with a view to develop and deploy student youth resource for working towards these principles.

It also aims at inculcating in youth the ideals and practice of service especially in relation to:

1. Taking care of their own health and that of others.
2. Understanding and accepting civic responsibility.
3. Promotion of national and international understanding and goodwill by using their international link of the movement.
4. Promotion of volunteerism.

1. YOUTH RED CROSS AFFILIATION:

All Govt./ Aided/ Non-Aided First Grade Colleges, Engineering, Health, Science, Agricultural, Horticultural, Veterinary Science, Forestry, Fisheries, Teacher Education, Law Colleges, Polytechnics and any recognized degree colleges shall apply to the Karnataka State Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society on the prescribed format for grant of affiliation by paying onetime fee which is presently Rs. 1,500/-. The Indian Red Cross Society, Karnataka State Branch shall within a period of 30 days of the receipt of application shall issue a certificate of affiliation to the applicant.

2. YOUTH RED CROSS MEMBERSHIP:

All students admitted to the Degree, Post Graduate and Diploma Courses by virtue of their joining the college / Polytechnic, keeping attendance as per university rules and paying the prescribed Youth Red Cross fee shall become the members of the Youth Red Cross of that college/ Polytechnic.

CORE GROUP VOLUNTEERS

Any member of YRC who can volunteer his/ her time and talent for the cause of Youth Red Cross can become a core group volunteer upon making an application to and on selection by the Youth Red Cross Programme Officer.



3. YOUTH RED CROSS UNIT:

- a) The Youth Red Cross units shall consist of 100 Core Group Volunteers or 330 of the total membership.
- b) A college / institute may organized more than one YRC unit for every 300 or more students.
- c) Where the student strength is below 300, the Youth Red Cross unit' may consist of less number of volunteers.

4. PROGRAMME OFFICER:

Programme Officer shall be appointed by the Principal of the College.


- a) From among the members of the teaching faculty who has the required knowledge, attitude, skills and values that the job demands.
- b) Other things being equal, the Physical Instructor (or equivalent) or Librarian may also be appointed.
- c) Faculty Members appointed on ad-hoc basis may also be considered at the discretion of the Principal.

5. TENURE:

The term of appointment of Youth Red Cross Programme Officers will be 3 years in the first Instance, extendable to another term subject to review of his performance by the Principal and University Youth Red Cross Nodal Officer.

6. FUNCTIONS OF PROGRAMME OFFICERS:

While all the activities of the YRC are expected to be planned, executed and evaluated by the volunteers themselves, the Programme Officers shall guide them as friend and philosopher. As the leader of the team his/ her role is to help the team set the goal and set the volunteers towards the goal.

7. OUT OF POCKET ALLOWANCE:

- a) The YRC Programme Officers are entitled to OPA of Rs.400/-p.m.
- b) In case of smaller units, the OPA entitlement will be 50% of the upper limit.



8. YRC STUDENT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE:

The YRC Unit shall conduct its day to day business by a duly constituted committee by Selecting or electing 10 members among the core group volunteers.

The Managing Committee in its first meeting shall select or elect their student Vice Chairman, Secretary, Joint Secretary. The Program Officer shall be the Chairperson.

9. YRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

At the college level there shall be an Advisory Committee consisting of

- a) Principal — Chairperson
- b) Programme Officer — Secretary
- c) One faculty member
- d) Student Vice Chairman
- e) Student Secretary
- f) One representative from District/Taluk Branch of IRCS.

Adequate representation of women to be ensured wherever applicable.

10. FUNCTIONS OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

The committee will meet at least twice a year

- a) To plan and review Youth Red Cross activities.
- b) To approve YRC Budget.
- c) To prepare action plan.
- d) To advice on YRC related programs and activities.
- e) To address YRC related issues and problems.

11. MAINTENANCE OF ACCOUNTS:

It shall be the responsibility of the college to maintain separate accounts of the Youth Red Cross fee received and ensure its periodic audit by a Chartered Accountant of the Govt./grant-in-aid/institutional norms as applicable. The institute/college shall submit audited statement of account to the Nodal officer.

12. FINANCIAL NORMS:

Out of the Fee of Rs.50/- collected from each student

a) Rs.15/- shall be credited to the State Branch of IRCS, KSB, Bengaluru. Out of Rs.15/- receivable by the IRCS, KSB, Rs.5/- per student shall be remitted to each University / Directorate for meeting the expenses on payment of honorarium etc., and conveying annual meeting of YRC Programme Officers for planning and review of Youth Red Cross activities.

b) Rs.35/- shall remain with the college for Programme Development of the Youth Red Cross.

The following items of expenditure shall be considered as valid under the programme development.

i) Travel cost of Programme Officers, Resource Persons and Volunteers.

ii) Project related expenses.

iii) Out of pocket allowance to Youth Red Cross Programme Officer.

iv) Postage and Printing.


v) Purchase of stationery, small equipment's and other contingent expenses needed to run the office.


vi) Refreshment/working lunch to volunteers.

vii) Training cost of volunteers not exceeding Rs.100/- per diem.

viii) Honorarium to resource persons not exceeding Rs.500/- per person.

ix) Part time clerical assistance at Rs.150/- p.m. Youth Red Cross fee collected shall not be diverted, re-appropriated or spent for the purpose and programs not related to Youth Red Cross.

13. CERTIFICATE:

Core group volunteers on completion of two years of volunteer ship and assigned tasks and targets shall be issued with certificates by the university. (Specimen annexed).

14. RECORDS AND REGISTERS:

The following records and registers are to be maintained by the YRC Unit.

- a) Youth Red Cross unit record.
- b) Cash book.
- c) Inventory register.
- d) Volunteer work diary.

15. ROLE OF INDIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY:

The State, District and Taluk Branch of the IRCS shall provide all the needed information expertise and consultancy services to the Youth Red Cross in their jurisdiction. At the same time the YRC Units need to keep contacts with the above offices for smooth and proper implementation of the programme.

16. YOUTH RED CROSS NODAL OFFICER:

At the University/ Directorate level there shall be a Nodal Officer on part time basis to guide, supervise, monitor, administer and control the YRC Units. The YRC Nodal Officers shall be appointed by the Vice- Chancellor of the University/ Head of the Directorate.

The following upper limit is fixed for payment of Out of Pocket Allowance/ Honorarium / Part Time Allowance and other contingent expenses of the Youth Red Cross Nodal Office.

17. ADVISORY COMMITTEE AT UNIVERSITY / DIRECTORATE LEVEL

The University Advisory Committee on Youth Red Cross shall be an apex body at the university level to guide and monitor the activities of YRC. The committee shall be constituted by the Vice Chancellor as Chair person and shall consist of:

One Representative nominated from the State Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society	Member
One YRC Programme Officer	Member
One Male and Female YRC volunteer	Members YRC University/

The Committee shall meet at least twice a year for Planning the Programs and undertake evaluation.

18. ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR YRC AT THE STATE LEVEL:

Most of the Departments have youth component built into their developmental planning both as a strategy and for building human resource for the effective implementation of their schemes. In order to liaise and co-ordinate with these departments, the State Government may consider to constitute a committee as they deem fit.

YOUTH RED CROSS PROGRAMME GUIDELINES.

1. VOLUNTEER ORIENTATION

Once the Core Group Volunteers are selected and the YRC Unit is formed the volunteers need to be oriented to make them understand their role and responsibilities. They should be empowered with the knowledge, attitude, skills and other competencies needed to perform as a member of the team. This may require two days and may be organized during the weekends. (Online YRC Programs can also be given at each college level)

2. TRAINING ON FIRST-AID

It is obligatory to all the core group volunteers to undergo the prescribed training in FirstAid as detailed out in Annexure-1. The Youth Red Cross Unit may organize this training course for the interested students of the college. The certificate issued by the IRCS which is an approved training and certifying agency shall be valid for obtaining motor vehicle driving license etc.,

3. TRAINING ON DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND MANAGEMENT

It is desirable to organize this program for core group volunteers and other Members of YRC on the core issues of calamities such as forecasting, vulnerability, retrofitting, communication, logistics, rescue, relief, rehabilitation, emergency health care etc., for details see Annexure-II. (Online Disaster Relief Training can also be given at each college level)

4. THE TRAINING ON MINIMUM COMPETENCIES

Learning takes place both in academic and co-curricular situations. A set of skills and competencies have been universally identified as minimum requirement to perform job demands or the civic responsibilities and in running the ordinary business of life. It is essential, that every student should try to acquire these competencies. For details see Annexure-III

5. MOTIVATION OF BLOOD DONORS

A minimum of two blood donation camp in a year should be organized by motivating donors from the members of YRC, NCC, NSS, Rovers & Rangers, Sports, Red Ribbon Clubs etc., At least 33% of core group members should donate blood during the 2 years period of their volunteer ship. For details see Annexure IV (as for as possible blood donation camp must be conducted along with IRCS blood bank/government hospital blood bank only).

8. INTERNSHIP AND ATTACHMENT

It is an optional activity for those who complete 2 years of volunteer ship. The ideal period of internship/ attachment will be the break between any two Semesters.

The idea is to familiarize the volunteer/s who by now have been sensitized on humanitarian service to apply their knowledge to field situations and to have an inter face with the community. It will be of duration of 7 days which can be completed as a week-long activity or on holidays and weekends that may be spread over, not more than a period of one month.

SELECTION OF AGENCY

The place or agency for attachment / internship may be identified by the volunteer himself or by the YRC Unit subject to approval of the Youth Red Cross Programme Officer.

THE ILLUSTRATIVE LIST OF PLACEMENT MAY BE

- a) Hospitals/ Dispensaries/Clinics/ Pharmacies/ Nursing Home
- b) Blood Banks/ Pathological Laboratories
- c) Fire Station/Traffic Control — Road Safety
- d) Old Age Homes / Rescue & Rehabilitation Centre / Beggar Colonies
- e) Opening Help Desk at Railway Station, Bus Stand and at any civic service centres.

Minimum attachments shall be for 56 hours spread over 7 days and to be certified as such by the concerned agency.
